CONNECTING

WIRED

1. Connect the **HDMI cable** to your laptop.
2. Tap **Laptop** on the touch panel.

PRESENTING

DISPLAY ONE DEVICE

1. Tap the touch panel to wake the system.
2. Under **Devices**, tap the device that you want to display.

PREVIEW DEVICE ON TOUCH PANEL


1. Under Actions, select **Video Preview**.
2. Tap **Desktop** to preview on the touch panel.
3. Tap the **arrow** to return to the touch panel menu.

USE HYBRID TEACHING TECHNOLOGY

1. Tap **Desktop** on the touch panel.
2. Log into the Desktop computer using your **Andrew** credentials and open the **Zoom App**.
3. **Start or join** a Zoom meeting.
4. Use the Zoom app to:
 - Change the audio and video settings for the conference camera and microphone.
 - Share your screen.
