Technology has become more important than ever to the finance industry. From applying machine learning to complex data sets and trading strategies to digitization aimed at enhancing customer relationships and risk management, software engineers and quantitative finance experts are being aggressively recruited by major financial firms with salaries rivaling those of Silicon Valley.

Constructed in 2020, TCS Hall at Carnegie Mellon University houses the convergence of financial and software engineering that is driving



change among the world's largest financial institutions.

The 90,000-square-foot building has classrooms, labs and maker spaces for the Institute for Software Research (ISR) as well as classrooms, offices and collaboration spaces for the

world-leading computational finance master's degree program (MSCF).

As such, **TCS Hall houses many of the brightest minds in software engineering, statistics and data science, and quantitative finance.**

The building also serves as the home of Carnegie Mellon's Center for Business Engagement, a new front door for corporations to forge partnerships across CMU. The biggest firms from Wall Street will visit TCS Hall seeking out talent from CMU's top-rated quantitative finance program. These include Citi, Bloomberg, Citadel, Bank of America, Morgan Stanley, Deutsche Bank, Blackrock, AQR, Fidelity, PNC and BNY Mellon.
