



Spring 2014 - Spring 2019



 Consistent breakdown by class designation across semesters keeps organizations representative of the campus undergraduate community.




- The size of the fraternity/sorority community has consistently decreased in size following the Fall 2016 semester.
- The Panhellenic sorority community has decreased by 24% (125 members) over the span of 5 years.




^{*}Due to lower membership and dual-gendered affiliation, MGC and NPHC membership is not displayed, but is included in overall Greek totals

- Currently, just under 19% of Carnegie Mellon University students are involved in the Greek community
- While the population of women attending Carnegie Mellon has increased it has not resulted in an increase sorority membership.
- IFC involvement has decreased from a 5-year high achieved in spring 2017 and spring 2018, where they accounted for 22% of the male student population




- The Panhellenic sorority population has maintained the highest consistent QPA of all the councils, and is trending upward in recent years.
- The Interfraternity Council population has shown improvement since a low point in Fall 2014, and has demonstrated a stable average of 3.28 over the past 7 semesters.
- Multicultural fraternities and sororities have rebounded from a council low in Fall 2014, with great improvement in the two following years and relative consistency the past two years.





- Note: This information does not include money raised during the annual Greek Sing philanthropy program.




• Over the past few years the Interfraternity Council and Panhellenic Council chapters have consistently reported fewer service hours.




- Fraternity and sorority member report notable involvement in other organizations on campus, maintaining numbers of participants in high 60% low 70%.
- Fraternity and sorority members holding leadership positions outside of their chapters has decreased in recent years.




 Members of Panhellenic sororities report being more involved, in clubs and organizations, than Interfraternity members from Spring 2014 until Spring 2018. Multicultural Greek members report of involvement has varied widely since 2015.




- Members of Panhellenic Sorority chapters consistently maintains a QPA at or above the All-Women's university average.
- Panhellenic Sorority chapter and New Member QPAs have remained above 3.2 for the past five years.







More than 60% of Panhellenic sorority members have been involved in clubs and organizations.




• The average QPA for initiated and new members of Interfraternity chapters have consistently fallen below the CMU All-Male average.




• The Interfraternity Council Community has fallen below the 600-member mark in Fall 2018-Spring 2019 for the first time in 5 years.




- The Interfraternity Council chapters reported increased overall involvement of members in non-Greek clubs and organizations over the past 5 years.
- Interfraternity Council members have reported fewer members as leaders of non-Greek clubs and organizations.



 The average QPA for Multicultural Greek chapter members and new members is comparable to the All-CMU Undergrad QPA average except for a notable drop in Spring 2015.




• The Multicultural Greek community welcomed the return of Kappa Phi Lambda in Fall 2018, accounting for an increase in overall numbers, and in new member numbers for Fall 2018.





 The introduction of Kappa Phi Lambda to the Multicultural Greek Community in Spring of 2018 accounts for a large increase in overall involvement and leadership.




