- These propositions have been lovingly dubbed the horsemen of the UC. Uses \$42,000 from the Student Government Operating Reserve and \$42,000 from the Senate reserve.
- The AB Tech Sound System is for mains, so that they can put on bigger and better shows. The purchase will save money in the long run.
- WRCT needs a library. They have run out of room – and that's stalled the expansion of their music library.
- Soundproofing – anti-reverberation materials installed so that we can hold lectures and concerts in the UC gym and actually have it sound good. It's important to be able to use the gym as a good rain location.
- Danforth Renovation – total cost is much more than what we're providing. If the Danforth renovation doesn't move forward, the money will be used for 3rd floor lounge renovations.
- Money for the Skibo renovation is coming from Tim Michael.
- Events Monitors have not been scrapped, but the project is stalled.

- What we would provide for Danforth Renovations is less than 10% of the total cost of the project. Danforth Renovations have been talked about since last year. Renovations include exercise equipment, carpeting, electrical work, etc.
- There were a series of forums last year about the Danforth Renovations. There is a need for additional exercise equipment, especially during peak hours. When the UC was designed, Danforth was supposed to be an athletic facility. Was in a meeting earlier tonight to discuss the possibility of the UC being open longer hours. Right now, the gym, locker rooms and all athletics facilities close at 10 pm. Hours would be extended later into the night.
- Regarding mains for AB Tech, the general idea is that the sound system they're using is about 30 years old. AB Tech will not cost significantly less for most shows – as most shows don't use mains.
- If they don't need the full amount we're giving to Danforth renovations, it'll go to renovations to the 3rd floor lounge. Ideas about ways to renovate the 3rd floor lounge were shoved to the side in light of other issues.
- Plan is to redistribute the chairs that are in Danforth throughout the UC so that total number of seats in the UC does not change. Another idea is to make it so that students can reserve the Alumni Lounge. Have been discussing the renovations with student groups that use Danforth, and it seems as though there are other options for them.
- The soundproofing of the gym would take place this summer.
- AB Tech is receiving an interest free loan from Dean Murphy to be paid back over the next five years. They're also using money they've saved from their JFC budget.
- The soundproofing for the gym would not affect the gym's use for athletics. The soundproofing cannot be broken.

- There are students at the University who really do not want Danforth to be changed. Not every group that uses Danforth was spoken to. Danforth is a gorgeous space – and it's not going to fix the athletics problem.
- It will help with the athletics problem.
- There was a whole movement last year to turn the UC basement into athletics facilities. Skibo and the UC gym are too overcrowded. Danforth is beautiful – but it needs to be used for other things.
- We have specialized rooms and non-specialized rooms. You can use Danforth for anything. If we make it into an athletics facility it will be specialized. The fact that there is only one piece of machinery for each set of muscles leads to crowds waiting for machine use really quickly.
- Plan is to put bout 20 machines in Danforth, extend hours at the UC and make new exercise spaces in dorms.
- There is no specific target in terms of number of machines per student. Right now the ratio is not good.
- The hours extension idea at the UC is fairly new. The money for the Danforth space would go towards purchasing new equipment and making space to handle that equipment.
- One the one hand, we're taking one of the best rooms for organizational meetings away. On the other, we're sorely in need of additional athletic facilities.
- Support the move to make Danforth an exercise facility. But we shouldn't be paying for the equipment – this is just the athletics department trying to weasel its way out of paying for the renovation.
- The activities fee goes towards improving student life. This is a small but necessary contribution.
- GSA is contributing \$15,000 out of its own budget for this. GSA is strongly behind this proposal. In order for this motion to work jointly, in order to the make use of the Student Government Operating Reserves for the other three things on

this list, the Danforth renovation needs to be included. Also, Skibo is a very old facility – renovations just can't occur there.

- The reason why the Danforth lounge was chosen is that it was originally supposed to be a gym space – and the UC basement idea did not work out.
- The plan to use the basement as an athletic facility was also before Andy's, Scotland Yard and the mail center were built.
- Athletics did renovate Skibo a little. GSA wants the Danforth proposal to go through, and we want other things. We might just have to accept this in order to get those other things.

6:46 pm **Business Affairs** (Ed Ryan)

- Business Affairs is the best committee.
- Campus Express Survey - Business Affairs has created a survey to collect information on how students view Campus Express. In particular, it will be looking for suggestions about which new vendors to make available to Campus Express users. Stephanie Rosenthal has set it all up. The survey should go live in the next couple of weeks, and will be sent to everyone.
- Work to Park - We are working with Parking Services to implement the "Parking Amnesty" policy, now called Work to Park. This will allow students to do community service to pay for their parking tickets. We are currently working out a few of the last details, before the program can come into effect.
- Feedback Boxes - It's been a project for some time to get feedback boxes installed in the University Center's business locations (Entropy, the Bookstore, and the Art Store). However, we are now running into trouble with Patricia Clifford (formerly Patricia Stacer), who is suddenly showing reluctance to complete the project. Cites the fact that no feedback has been given – we'd like to have the boxes around before we make that judgement.
- Financial Aid for Foreign Students - It has come to the attention of this committee that foreign students are not able to receive financial aid from CMU. We are currently investigating the policies of other universities, to find whether this is a common practice.
- Tuition - We have been discussed with Jared Cohon and Bill Elliot the prospect of getting more student involvement in the tuition decision process. As a first step, we want to make the process more open. The decision for this year has already been made (and a member of the Business Affairs committee was

present at the meeting of the Board of Trustees), and there will be a tuition increase of 3.26%. That increase is roughly in line with inflation.

- Computing Services - Business Affairs is investigating the Technology Fee and the future of the printing policy. Along these lines, we are in contact with Computing Services, and will render further updates as updates become available.

- Our first big event is taking place right before Carnival. It will be the CMU Gear Sale, at which Senate will be selling CMU gear at cost to students to get more of it out there. - Our next big event is at Carnival. Saturday evening, Night Market is happening in the UC, and we are booked in the Connan Room for two hours for our Singled Out event! Nasheena and Adam are hosting, Sophia is the lovely assistant, and the student body will vote the contestants on in weeks leading up to the event by putting money in specific jars at Senate tables. (This will also require tabling volunteers!) We'll be creating a pool of well-known and diverse students (race,

ethnicity, gender, orientation will all be considered) for the student body to choose from, and all money raised will go towards funding the dates awarded at the end. Hope to see you there! If you are interested in being a contestant, or know someone who would want to be a contestant, e-mail me!

- No one loves Adam at Office hours! We believe response will be better when each committee is represented, according to Maureen's plan. Until then, Campus Life office hours are an experiment in hiatus.

SDC is meeting with Housing about gender identity issues, and Campus Life will involve itself as much as possible in the dialogue. We believe this is an important issue to resolve, as every student deserves to feel at home in University Housing. It would be really great to have one or two gender-blind floors that people could opt to live in.
- Ed Ryan and Adam will be meeting with Pomona Valero about the future of the Printing Policy. Also, Adam will be meeting with yet another Facilities Management representative to see if his "Andrew Time" plan was a pipe dream or SHEER BRILLIANCE!
- Campus Life intends to send the student body at least one survey, and that is on satisfaction with arts, arts resources, and arts facilities on campus. The other possibility, which will be addressed at this week's committee meeting is sending out a dining survey that would ask questions that might be helpful when determining Dining's future.
