0607-003 – Special Allocation of \$1500 to Southwestern Program for Deliberative Democracy for Campus Conversations 2006-2007

**Date:** Spring 2007

**Request:** Campus Conversations is an initiative which uses Deliberative Polling® to gather an understanding of what the student body thinks about an issue by polling participants before and after they deliberate on an issue.

**Additional funding sources:** Office of the Provost, English Department, and the Dean of Student Affairs.

**Budget:**

Catering: \$500

Participant Incentives (\$25 Student Random Sample participant): \$500

Web-site: \$300

Advertising (posters, flyers): \$300

Project Management: \$1000

Document Design: \$1500

Total Cost: \$4100

**Committee Decision:** The Finance Committee felt that while Student Senate should show it's support for Campus Conversations, an allocation this large would set too high a precedent for future requests from Campus Conversations. While the event is beneficial for campus, the committee felt that \$1500 would be an appropriate sum, and would provide a bar for other organizations, such as GSA, to provide funding for this event. Senate would be paying for Participant incentives and Project Management.

0607-004 – Special Allocation of \$2500 to Jolanta Lion for Faces of Democracy: The CMU International Film Festival

**Date:** November 29 – December 10

**Request:** The 2006 CMU International Film Festival will provide free movie showings in McConomy Auditorium as well as showings at the South Side Works (open to the public, discounted for CMU). In addition, international film directors will be on campus to speak about their movies and provide free workshops.

**Additional funding sources:** *Confirmed:* Dean of H&SS, Sprout Fund.  
*Anticipated/Requested:* On-campus departments, Polish Cultural Institute, 10 Ethnic Organizations, Donations, Ticket Sales, South Side Works, Whole Foods, LOT Polish Airlines, and WYEP.

**Budget:**

Administrative Expenses: \$6,700  
Programming Expenses: \$16,400  
Marketing Expenses: \$11,300  
Facility Expenses: \$4,000  
Equipment/Tech Expenses: \$1,000  
Misc. Expenses (Including Hosting Directors): \$11,500

Total Expenses Projected: \$50,900

**Committee Decision:** The Finance Committee was split on this allocation (2 for \$2500 – 2 for \$3000). The committee was enthusiastic on funding the event, but was unable to agree on how much to fund it. Half the committee felt that \$2500 was sufficient for funding the event and would not hinder its success. The other half felt that based on its value, it deserved more money. The \$2500 would pay for part of the programming expense for film costs.

**Vote:** Simple Majority

**Media Restriction:** Yes. Since this is a film festival there are restrictions filming the movies themselves, however everything else may be filmed.

**Original Request:** \$5000
