### #16 Carnegie Mellon (17-3, 7-2 UAA)

**Series:** New York University leads the all-time series 29-10. In the last meeting the Tartans won 89-85 in double overtime January 8 in New York.

Carnegie Mellon leads the all-time series 21-14 over Brandeis. In the last meeting the Tartans won 103-85 January 6 in Boston.

**Carnegie Mellon Last Time Out:** Carnegie Mellon defeated the University of Chicago 76-67 Sunday, February 5 at Skibo Gymnasium. The Tartans waited 37 minutes before taking their first lead of the game, 66-65. Carnegie Mellon then finished the game on a 13-2 run to come away with their seventeenth win.

Nate Maurer led the way for the Tartans with a game-high 26 points, with Clayton Barlow-Wilcox and Marques Johnson each adding 14 in the win. Maurer went 13-16 from the free throw line, and Barlow-Wilcox's game-high 11 rebounds gave him his third straight double-double and ninth on the season.

**New York Last Time Out:** New York University had its four-game winning streak snapped Sunday, February 5, in Atlanta, Georgia when they lost 93-77 to Emory University. Jason Boone tied a career-high with 26 points, and also added 10 rebounds for NYU. Michael DeCorso registered a double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds and Jared Kildare finished with 13 points and seven assists in the losing cause.

NYU jumped out to an early 12-4 lead before Emory fought back and eventually took the lead 23-20 with 8:17 to play in the first half. The Violets then used a 9-2 run to jump back on top 29-25, but the Eagles outscored NYU 17-8 the rest of the half, taking a 42-37 lead into the break. The second half was all Emory. After trading baskets to start the second stanza, Emory went on a 13-4 run to open their lead to 70-57 with 8:36 to play. NYU would not get closer than 11 points the rest of the way.

**Brandeis Last Time Out:** Sophomore guard Steve DeLuca scored a career-high for the third straight Sunday, tallying 35 points and 13 rebounds to lead Brandeis University past host Case Western Reserve, 74-70, in overtime. Paced by 14 first half points from senior guard Funso Lafe, Case bolted out to a 10-point lead, 38-28, at halftime. In the second half, DeLuca led Brandeis back from as many as 13 points down to tie the game 65-65 and send the contest into overtime.

Brandeis tied the game 63-63 with 49 seconds to play when Joe Coppens split a pair of free throws. Lafe then connected on two free throws to give Case the two-point lead but Brandeis answered right back as Kwame Graves-Fulgham hit a lay-up with 11 seconds left. An Oren three-point try at the buzzer rimmed out to bring the overtime period. The Judges scored the first six points in overtime which proved to be too much for the Spartans to overcome. Coppens finished with 17 points and DeLuca recorded a game-high 13 rebounds for the Judges.

#### Making History:

Carnegie Mellon's 10-0 start this season marked the best start in school history. The Tartans started the 2003-2004 season 4-0 before dropping a 90-60 decision to Division I Robert Morris.

#### There is Always a First:

The Tartans are currently ranked 16th in the D3hoops.com Top 25. This season marks the first top-25 ranking in school history by D3hoops.com. The Tartans are not only ranked 16th in the nation, but ranked third in the first NCAA Great Lakes Region Rankings as announced Wednesday, February 8. The third place ranking in the region marks the highest ever in school history.

#### From Way Downtown:

Senior **A.J. Straub** is in second place on Carnegie Mellon's career three-point field goals made list with 185 for his career. Straub has made a three-pointer in 23 straight games dating back to last season.

#### Climbing the Charts:

Junior **Greg Gonzalez** currently ranks eighth on Carnegie Mellon's career block list with 80. He needs two more blocks to surpass Charlie Connors (1990-94) for seventh place.

#### Perfect at the Half:

The Tartans are 10-0 when leading after the first twenty minutes of play.

#### NCAA Rankings:

The Tartans rank fifth in the NCAA in rebound margin (9.7), 17th in scoring offense (86.4 ppg) and 17th in winning percentage (85.0). **A.J. Straub** ranks 19th in 3-point field goal % (.455)

#### UAA Rankings:

The Tartans rank first in the UAA in scoring offense (86.4 ppg), 3-point field goal % (.377), and assists (18.45 apg); second in field goal % (.478), steals (7.70), rebounding (42.7 rpg), and free throw % (.712). **Maurer** ranks first in scoring (19.3) and third in 3-point field goal % (.419), **Straub** ranks second in 3-point field goal % (.455), **Barlow-Wilcox** ranks fifth in scoring (17.1) and third in rebounding (8.9). **Johnson** ranks third in field goal % (.577) and sixth in assists (3.40), **Geoff Kozak** ranks fourth in steals (1.60).

#### 1,500 Club:

Senior **Nate Maurer** reached the 1,500 point plateau January 27 against Chicago. He now has 1,576 career points. Maurer is a transfer from Grove City College where he scored 740 points in two years for the Wolverines.

#### Winning Season:

Carnegie Mellon has secured their third straight season with a winning record for the first time since the 1976-1979 seasons. This marks only the second time in school history that they have had three consecutive winning seasons.
