## Carnegie Mellon (2-0) vs. Oberlin (0-3)

### Radisson/Carnegie Mellon Tournament:

This marks the 15th year Carnegie Mellon has hosted a four-team tournament over Thanksgiving weekend. Carnegie Mellon has compiled a 15-11 tournament record. The 2004 tournament was made up of Carnegie Mellon, Westminster, Hood and Framingham State. Westminster College won the championship with a 102-100 victory over the Tartans, the first time in two years that Carnegie Mellon has not won the championship game.

Seniors Clayton Barlow-Wilcox and A.J. Straub earned All-Tournament team honors. Barlow-Wilcox recorded back-to-back double-doubles as he averaged 22 points and 12 rebounds. Straub hit nine three pointers and averaged 16 points per game for the tournament.

Assistant Coach Kevin Byrne was named all-tournament in 1994 and 1995. Below is a list of the Championship Games:

**Carnegie Mellon Last Time Out:** The Tartans handed the Wolverines of Grove City an 80-64 defeat on the second night of the West Penn Classic improving to 2-0 on the young season. Carnegie Mellon took an early 11-8 lead and never looked back the rest of the night. The Tartans led by two with 6:34 to play in the first half before sophomore guard Geoff Kozak drilled a three pointer to extend their lead to 23-18. The Tartans then would open the lead to 38-30 heading into the locker room.

Carnegie Mellon started the second half where they left off. The Tartans compiled a 9-0 run in the first 4:16 to take the 47-30 advantage. Carnegie Mellon's biggest lead of the night came after a lay-up by senior Clayton Barlow-Wilcox giving them a 72-44 lead with 5:58 to play.

The Tartans had four players in double figures for the second straight. Leading the way with a game-high 18 points and a career-high 17 rebounds was Barlow-Wilcox. Senior Nate Maurer and junior Greg Gonzalez had 13 points each, while senior A.J. Straub cashed in with 10 points. Gonzalez grabbed 10 boards to record his second career double-double.

Barlow-Wilcox was named to the All-Classic Most Valuable Player, as Maurer was named to the All-Classic Team.
