Carnegie Mellon (7-0, 1-0 UAA) vs. Skidmore (2-4)

Series: Carnegie Mellon leads the series 1-0.

Last Meeting: Carnegie Mellon defeated visiting Skidmore College 79-69 Saturday, December 11, 2004 at Skibo Gymnasium. The Tartans had four players in double figures; Clayton Barlow-Wilcox led all Tartan scorers with 16 points and pulled in eight rebounds. Michael Divens finished with 15 points and pulled in a career high 13 rebounds, Eliot Goren had 14 and Nate Maurer added 11 points for Carnegie Mellon.

The Tartans shot 49.2% for the game to the Thoroughbreds 34.8%. Carnegie Mellon also led the way on the glass hauling in 52 boards as Skidmore grabbed 38.

Carnegie Mellon Last Time Out: The Tartans and their high-flying fast paced play improved to 7-0 on Tuesday, December 6 after handing the visiting Lycoming College Warriors a 99-83 defeat in Skibo Gymnasium. Nate Maurer needed only four seconds to put the Tartans on top 2-0 on a lay-up off a pass from senior Clayton Barlow-Wilcox, the Tartans never relinquished the lead the rest of the night.

Six Tartans hit double figures in points, with Marques Johnson and Barlow-Wilcox leading the way with 17 points apiece. Johnson tied his career-high in points and recorded six rebounds and five assists. Barlow-Wilcox hauled down 10 rebounds to record his fourth double-double of the season. Carnegie Mellon received strong bench play as senior Bary Dunn chipped in with 16 points, including three dunks, and junior Brad Matta added a career-high 12 points. Senior guard A.J. Straub was the sixth Tartan in double figures, as he contributed 10 points on 2-3 shooting from three-point range.

Skidmore Last Time Out: Skidmore dropped an 83-49 decision to Utica College Tuesday night, December 6. With the loss the Thoroughbreds fall to 2-4 overall. Skidmore was led by sophomore Jonah Haviland-Markowitz coming off the bench recording a double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds. The Thoroughbreds had two other players in double figures, as senior Reed Juckett and freshman Jake Shechtman each had 12 points.

Skidmore shot 32.7% from the field and grabbed 23 rebounds as Utica shot 47.8% and pounded the glass for 56 boards. The Thoroughbreds committed just 15 turnovers to the Pioneers 17 although, Utica capitalized with 22 points off of turnovers to Skidmore's eight.

Making History:

Carnegie Mellon's 7-0 start marks the best start in school history. The Tartans started the 2003-2004 season 4-0 before dropping a 90-60 decision to Division I Robert Morris.

Wingen Watch:

Carnegie Mellon Head Coach Tony Wingen needs nine wins to become the All-Time winningest coach in school history. Wingen currently has 165 wins.

UAA Rankings:

The Tartans are ranked first in the UAA in scoring offense (90.7 ppg.) 3-point field goal % (.402) and assists per game (20.29) and second in rebounding (41.9 rpg.) and blocks per game (4.14). **Nate Maurer** ranks second in points (19.6 ppg.), **Barlow-Wilcox** is ranked third in rebounding (9.3 rpg.), and junior **Greg Gonzalez** is ranked second in field goal % (71.9).

Staying Perfect:

The Tartans have won 13 straight non-conference regular season contests.

Climbing the Charts:

Senior **A.J. Straub** is in second place on Carnegie Mellon's career three-point field goals made list with 145 for his career.

1,000 Club:

Senior **Clayton Barlow-Wilcox** has 911 career points. He needs 89 to become the 16th Tartan to reach 1,000 points for their career.

Honors:

Senior forward **Nate Maurer** was named UAA and ECAC Southern Men's Basketball Athlete of the Week for leading the Tartans to a 72-71 road win over 12th-ranked Rochester in the opening Association game of the season. The Tartan victory snapped the Yellowjackets' 23-game UAA home winning streak and gave the Tartans their first win at Rochester since 1996. In the win Maurer scored a career-high 41 points, two points shy of the Carnegie Mellon single game record set by Bill Soffa during the 1957-58 season. He set a school record with seven three-pointers hitting 7-of-8 for the game.
