Carnegie Mellon (6-0, 1-0 UAA) vs. Lycoming (3-3)

Series: This is the first ever meeting between the two schools.

Carnegie Mellon Last Time Out: The Tartans rallied from 13 down in the second half to defeat the 12th ranked Yellojackets of Rochester 72-71 Saturday, December 3 to improve to 6-0, 1-0 UAA. Senior Nate Maurer capped a career night by hitting the game-winning jumper with 2.2 seconds left to end Rochester's 23 game home UAA win streak and gave the Tartans their first win in Rochester since 1996.

Rochester took a 39-26 halftime score to the locker room, as Carnegie Mellon didn't score over the final four minutes of the period. Maurer turned up his game during the second half as he went on to score 31 of his career-high 41 points. He went 6-7 in the second period from behind the arc, including a bank shot with two minutes to play that brought the Tartans within one point.

With 15 seconds left and Carnegie Mellon down 71-70, Senior Clayton Barlow-Wilcox grabbed a defensive rebound off a missed jumper. After a Carnegie Mellon timeout, Maurer hit what would be the game-winning shot. Maurer's shot gave the Tartans their first lead since the 10:47 mark of the first half. A half court shot by Tim Brackney hit the front iron at the buzzer preserving the 72-71 win for the Tartans.

Barlow-Wilcox was the only other Tartan in double figures with 16 points, as he added five steals. Freshman guard Corey O'Rourke had four assists off the bench. For the first time all year, Carnegie Mellon did not have a bench player score a point.

Lycoming Last Time Out: Lycoming defeated FDU-Florham on Saturday afternoon, December 3, 64-44 for their first conference win on the young season and evened their record at 3-3 and 1-1 in the Freedom conference. The Warriors were led by sophomore Kevin Morris with a season-high 21 points shooting 5-10 from behind the arc. Senior Jonathan Pribble added 11 points and seven rebounds, while sophomore Dave Wilson had 10 points.

Lycoming out-rebounded the Devils 48-34 including 15 offensive boards that led to 11 second chance points for the Warriors. Lycoming's bench, led by Morris, out-scored the Devils' 27-15 in the victory.

Making History:

Carnegie Mellon's 6-0 start marks the best start in school history. The Tartans started the 2003-2004 season 4-0 before dropping a 90-60 decision to Division I Robert Morris.

Wingen Takes Step Closer:

Carnegie Mellon's Head Coach Tony Wingen needs 10 wins to become the All-Time winningest coach in school history. Wingen currently has 164 wins.

Three Digit Scores:

The Tartans scored 100 points in a 106-70 victory over Oberlin College in the first day of the Radisson / Carnegie Mellon Tournament. The Tartans scored 100 points last season in the tournament falling 102-100 to Westminster in the championship game. Prior to last season, Carnegie Mellon had not scored 100 or more points in a game since 1996 when they defeated Thiel College 110-96.

Climbing the Charts:

Senior **A.J. Straub** is in second place on Carnegie Mellon's career three-point field goals made list with 143 for his career.

1,000 Club:

Senior **Clayton Barlow-Wilcox** has 894 career points. He needs 106 to become the 16th Tartan to reach 1,000 points for their career.

UAA Rankings:

The Tartans are ranked first in the UAA in 3-point field goal percentage (.404) and assists per game (20.0) and second in scoring offense (89.3 ppg.) and blocks per game (4.33). **Nate Maurer** ranks second in points (20.2 ppg.), **Barlow-Wilcox** is ranked third in rebounding (9.2 rpg.), and junior **Greg Gonzalez** is ranked second in field goal % (71.4).

Staying Perfect:

The Tartans have won 12 straight non-conference regular season contests.
