2011 Carnegie Mellon Volleyball



Head Coach Kim Kelly

Kim Kelly begins her 16th year of coaching in 2011 and enters her seventh year at Carnegie Mellon. In 2007, Kelly earned her 300th career victory and her 2008 squad appeared in the NCAA Division III Women's Volleyball Championship, defeating Lebanon Valley in the first round.

In six years, she has led the Tartans to two ECAC South Volleyball Championships and two third-place finishes in the highly-touted University Athletic Association (UAA). Overall, the Tartans are 117-101 under Kelly and continue to play some of the toughest competition in Division III, as the UAA has claimed three of the last four national championships.

Prior to Carnegie Mellon, Kelly was the head women's volleyball coach at Gettysburg College from 1996 through 2004. During her tenure, the Bullets posted a 250-82 record, captured eight Centennial Conference titles and appeared in eight NCAA Division III Championship Tournaments. She was an assistant coach at Gettysburg for four seasons before becoming head coach.

A member of the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) and chairman of the Mid-Atlantic All-Regional team selection committee for two years, Kelly also served as a member of the Mid-Atlantic Region Selection Committee for the NCAA Division III Tournament.

A 1992 graduate of Gettysburg, Kelly was regarded as one of the top setters ever to play for the Bullets. During her four seasons (1988-91), she was credited with 2,079 assists, the third-highest total in school history. Kelly earned a bachelor's degree in chemistry from Gettysburg and a master's of business administration from Mount St. Mary's in 2003.

Kelly and her husband Doug reside in Irwin, Pa., with their two children Samantha (ten) and Zachary (eight).



Assistant Coach Anne Bock

The 2011 volleyball season will mark the first for Anne Bock on the staff as a part-time assistant coach at Carnegie Mellon University.

Bock started her coaching career at Princeton University as an assistant from 1998-99 and moved on to West Virginia University where she was a graduate assistant from 1999-2000. Bock then went on to become the head coach at Plum High School from 2002-03 before working with the Pittsburgh Elite Volleyball Club as an assistant coach during the 2005 season.

Bock received her Bachelor of Science degree in pre-genetic counseling from Juniata College in 1998. While at Juniata, Bock played for her father Larry Bock, the all-time collegiate leader in wins, for four seasons while the team compiled a 159-17 record during that

span. She was part of four NCAA Division III playoff teams, including three appearances in the final four with national runner-up finishes in 1996 and 1997. As a captain her senior season, Bock was honored by the AVCA as a member of the All-Region team.

The four-year standout at Juniata went on to earn her master's degree in coaching education from West Virginia University in 2000 and a master's degree in counselor education from Duquesne University in 2003.

Bock currently works as a school counselor for the Westmoreland Intermediate Unit and resides in Murrysville, Pa.
