



The website for the Higher Education Mac OS X Lab Deployment Initiative has the goal of facilitating the task of installing and maintaining Mac OS X in a computer lab. We find and document solutions to a host of challenges that commonly arise when deploying labs in a higher education environment. The results of our efforts can serve as a roadmap for others to use as they plan to roll out Mac OS X at their institutions.

- Documentation** We are producing documentation in the areas of: Inventory of Products and Tools; Configuration of Lab Machines; Security of Lab Machines; Integration with Existing Infrastructure; Storage and Backups; Special Purpose Labs
