Joint Israeli - Palestinian Summer Programme on Political Science and Middle East Studies at Galilee College, Israel, July 3rd - August 14th, 2007.

The program is intended for students of History, Political Science, Middle East Studies and professionals interested in the Middle East. The course is aimed at extending the participants knowledge of conditions, developments and trends in Israel, Palestine and the environs. Lectures will be held by Palestinian and Israeli academics and experts and will offer a balanced view of the situation in the region. The 2007 programme will also include events that allow first hand exposure to the Israeli - Palestine conflict: meeting with Palestinian NGOs, visit to a Jewish settlement, meeting with people from Arab villages in Israel, participating in a panel of representatives from the different political parties in Israel, etc.
