MESSAGE FROM THE ASSOCIATE DEAN OF THE CAREER & PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT CENTER

Greetings from Carnegie Mellon University,

As our focus shifts from running an online university in spring 2020 to preparing for Carnegie Mellon University's (CMU) fall semester, I would like to share information about how the Career & Professional Development Center (CPDC) is positioning itself to support you. CMU plans to operate in a <u>Hybrid Semester</u> model this fall. To adhere to physical distancing and other required health guidelines outlined by the school and local government, the CPDC decided to convert our large in-person recruiting events to virtual formats for the fall 2020 semester.

In the past, virtual recruiting events experienced limited success when compared to in-person offerings. With today's landscape severely limiting f2f recruiting, the question is, "How can we, CMU and employers, help students embrace a virtual recruiting experience?" I believe the answer lies within both our institutions.

This spring and throughout the summer, the CPDC team is working to prepare students for the new recruiting landscape. Online fairs, virtual information sessions, video

interviews, etc. – we are preparing students to be successful in the new recruiting paradigm. Highlighting the advantages of an online recruiting experience has helped students accept the new reality of what their employment searches will look like this fall – and some students are excited about the new format.

The CPDC would like to share some lessons we have learned in our spring/summer programming efforts to help your organization prepare for the fall. As career development and recruiting professionals, we need to seize the opportunity to reconsider our programming. We have the chance to try new approaches and shed antiquated efforts. One example that has gained traction is moving away from traditional

information gatherings to employer-led skill development sessions. By providing students a professional

development opportunity, interlaced with information about their company, employers are attracting larger, more diverse, audiences than they normally draw through an hour-long information session held on campus.

Another lesson learned is that simply moving an in-person offering onto Zoom does not constitute an effective online strategy – this was a painful lesson to learn. We (higher education and recruiters) need to fully utilize available technology to offer a positive and personal user experience when conducting online programming. For example, CMU career fairs are famous for high student attendance and corresponding long wait lines. The virtual fair technology CMU is implementing this fall can lessen student wait times, reduce repetitive conversations for employers, and improve the user experience for all event participants if we leverage the features within the system. We would love to work with you on this endeavor.

The CPDC can help your team strategize and build a robust virtual recruiting effort that will help you achieve your goals this fall. And as always, thank you for your commitment to partner with and recruit at CMU.
