

ARTS GREENHOUSE COMMUNITY IMPACT Partner Fact Sheet

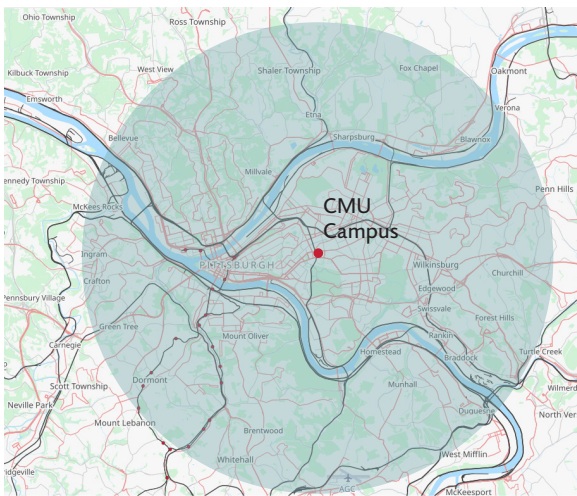


CRITERIA

Arts Greenhouse was founded to serve Pittsburgh youth who are experiencing a lack of educational equity due to racial and socioeconomic disparities.

Consequently, Arts Greenhouse uses the following criteria to select regular partners:

- Host site is within an ~7-mile radius from Carnegie Mellon University's main campus
- A designated Title 1 school OR 50% of students are identified as economically disadvantaged
- At least 25% of the student population identify as non-white
- Organizations serving communities that fall into the previous criteria
