

Dear Parents:

I write to ask you to participate in our research on child development. Laboratory visits last 1-2 hours and typically involve your child playing fun math, word games and computer games, as well as taking standardized tests like those he/she takes in school. Each child receives toys and prizes as tokens of our appreciation. Study participants will also receive \$10 per hour for their time and participation.





Laboratory visits can be scheduled at your convenience, with some appointments available during evenings and weekends. If you drive to our laboratory, located at the Center for Brain Imaging (across from Strong Memorial Hospital), we have convenient free parking available for your use, and we will provide clear driving directions.

The data that we gather allow us to answer important questions about children's brain and behavioral development. These data will be used for research or educational purposes only and will never be reported in any manner that identifies you

or your child. Our findings have been published in journals and the popular press and have had an impact on theories of child development, the advice that professionals offer parents, and public policy affecting children. The success of this work critically depends upon your willingness to participate.
