




Dear REACH Families,

We are pleased to announce the official start of our new REACH (Research on Emerging Adults' Changing Health) Study. We will be enrolling people into the study over the next 3 years. We will provide you with details when you become eligible (4 years after expected high school graduation).


I promised I would share some results with you from the *Transition Times Study*. One of our most important findings is that there are no differences between the participants with and without diabetes in terms of what they are doing after high school. As shown below, three-quarters of each group was attending school full-time, half of each group was working, and living situations were comparable. Of those attending college, about one-quarter were living at home. Of those not in college, 70% were living at home.









The car show runs from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. on July 21 and July 22. In addition to the car show, you can also watch 150 vintage racers compete on the golf course track all day.

Parking is available at Flagstaff Hill for the event, but there is a \$15 charge.

Great Trail Festival

This festival runs for two weekends: August 25-26 and September 1-3. The festival is held annually at the Great Trail Festival Grounds and features exhibitors from Ohio and surrounding states.
