

## Oscar Trivia

- Kate Winslet is the youngest actress to have received 6 Oscar nominations. She was previously nominated for her work in Sense and Sensibility, Titanic, Iris, Eternal Sunshine of the Spotless Mind, and Little Children.
- Spencer Tracy, Fredric March, Gary Cooper, Marlon Brando, Dustin Hoffman, Tom Hanks, Jack Nicholson, and Daniel Day-Lewis are the actors with the most awards. They each won the Best Actor award twice.
- Katharine Hepburn is the actress with the most awards. She won the Best Actress award four times.
- The Oscar statuette is officially called the *Academy Award of Merit*. Made of gold-plated britannium on a black metal base, it is 13.5 in tall, weighs 8.5 lb. It depicts a knight rendered in Art Deco style holding a crusader's sword standing on a reel of film with five spokes. The five spokes each represent the original branches of the Academy: Actors, Writers, Directors, Producers, and Technicians
- In 1939 Gone with the Wind was the first all-color film to win Best Picture.
- In 1969 Midnight Cowboy was the first and only X-rated film to win Best Picture.
- The Godfather trilogy and The Lord of the Rings trilogy are the only trilogies to have all three films nominated for Best Picture
- The Private Life of Henry VIII was the first foreign film to be nominated for Best Picture in 1933.
- The Lord of the Rings: The Return of the King is the first and only fantasy film to win Best Picture

- Ben-Hur, Titanic, and Lord of the Rings: The Return of the King have each won 11 Academy Awards
- Before becoming Richard Nixon in Frost/Nixon, Frank Langella played the parts of Dracula, Sherlock Holmes, and Skeletor on the big screen.
- Heath Ledger is the sixth actor, behind James Dean, Spencer Tracy, Peter Finch, Ralph Richardson and Massimo Troisi, to be nominated posthumously for an Oscar. Only Finch won, for his mad-as-hell newsman Howard Beale in 1976's "Network."
