WHAT IS THE PITTSBURGH SUMMER INTERNSHIP PROGRAM?

Commonly referred to as PSIP, the program provides support and resources to Dietrich College undergraduate students as they complete their first internship experience at a non-profit, start-up or small business in the Pittsburgh area. The program assists students who have limited professional experience by helping with applications, offering ongoing career workshops, and vetting host sites to ensure interns receive direct mentorship and supervision.

Interns complete 175-200 hours of work at a local organization and are paid \$3,300 in a summer stipend.

Internships start after the spring semester and end in late July or early August!

Ma	arch	Students invited to the program then apply directly to internship job postings for interviews with Host Sites
A	pril	Host Sites make internship offers & additional rounds of applications or interviews occur as needed
