

S3 ADMIN CONSOLE – SUMMARY OF RELEASE #2

October 7, 2011

One of the primary goals of Release #2 was to resolve many of the “bugs” found by the early adopters group before releasing S3 to a wider group of new users.

New users should reference the S3 QuickStart Guide for basic “how to” instructions. At this time, no SIS screens have been retired.

Release Highlights

- Wildcard functionality was added to certain Student and Course search fields
- Student’s preferred name was added to course rosters

Corrected Technical Issues:

- ✓ Removed certain data that was misleading or potentially inaccurate, such as ‘Local Telephone’ and ‘Dates of Enrollment’ from the Student: Summary page
- ✓ Resolved missing data on the Degree Declaration screen and others
- ✓ Fixed various display issues found when using Internet Explorer
- ✓ Improved format issues including spacing and alignment, repositioning, etc.
- ✓ Eliminated errors that occurred during Feedback submission for some users

Related Functionality Not Yet Released

- Student screens: Complete contact information for student and listed “Family & Friends”
- Student screens: SIO Admin features such as Unofficial Academic Record and Planned Schedule
- Course screens: many S3 users do not yet have add, update or delete access

Coming in the Next Six Months...

- Development of OLR and the registration screens in SIS starting with the letter ‘O’ (referred to as ‘O’ screens)
- Development and release of Student Account screens
- Fine tune authorization for S3 users

Identified Technical Issues:

- Continue to update/correct displayed data such as Student - Advisor; Course - Begin semester and Last Offered semester
- Improve the logic that drives which semester is displayed, and holding the semester from one screen to the next
- Review/adjust the data displayed on the Student: Waitlist screen
