Your letter of recommendation will be read by the Selection Committee, which is composed of former Churchill Scholars, who are, for the most part, academic scientists in a variety of fields. There is normally a mathematician, a physicist, a chemist, an engineer, and two different kinds of biologist.

**Please note:** The Churchill Scholarship is an extremely competitive award. We only accept up to two nominations from a limited number of US institutions. Therefore **all** of the applications we receive are from among the very best STEM students in the country. Recommendation letters are instrumental for the Selection Committee to distinguish Churchill Scholar recipients from within a pool of exceptional scholars. While we greatly appreciate your honest assessment of an applicant's record, we would also like to know why, specifically, you have reached your conclusions about a student.

- (1) How long have you known the applicant? In what capacity?
- (2) Please comment in detail on the applicant's academic work in the sciences, engineering, or mathematics. If relevant, please comment on his or her research in the laboratory or elsewhere. How has that work demonstrated the applicant's intellectual creativity and originality? It is not necessary to repeat information already included in the student's transcript or application (e.g., grades, GPA and awards), unless you consider something particularly noteworthy or can provide additional context.
- (3) How does the applicant rank when compared to other recent students in your department or laboratory and with other students who have won major postgraduate scholarships? How would you rank the applicant in overall achievement among the students you have taught or directed in research? It is common for those writing letters of recommendation to write in superlatives, so it is useful to have concrete examples and the particular rationale for your high regard.
- (4) How do you think he or she will perform in the independent research environment of a Cambridge Master's program? The Churchill Foundation does not necessarily seek so-called "well rounded" applicants and encourages people who have "interesting jagged edges" who have deep strengths in a few areas. Churchill Scholars are known not solely for their outstanding academic and research achievements but also for their contributions to the intellectual, athletic, dramatic, musical, and social life at Churchill College and at the University of Cambridge. How would the applicant represent your institution, the Churchill Foundation, and the United States?
