### ID Card Photo

Please submit a photograph for your official CMU ID Card by July 1 to ensure that your card is ready prior to the beginning of the fall semester. In addition to appearing on your ID Card, your photo is loaded into your Student Information Online (SIO) portal, which is viewable by your advisors and professors so they can recognize you once your coursework begins.

### AP, IB and Transfer Credits

Contact the College Board by July 1 to request that your AP scores be sent to Carnegie Mellon. Scores should be submitted to CMU from the College Board by July 31; however, we will continue to receive and process scores throughout the summer. You should also submit any applicable pre-college transfer credits according to the guidelines on the website below. International students may submit IB Higher Level exam scores but may only receive credit for scores of six or seven.
