Michael G. Zamagias is the founder and CEO of a multifaceted portfolio specializing in commercial real estate development, leasing and property management, student housing, banking and finance, energy development and healthcare technology. He began his career in his early twenties as a residential salesperson in Johnstown, PA. In 1984, he moved to Pittsburgh and founded his own company which became Zamagias Properties in 1987. Michael launched his signature property deal in 1988 at Robinson Town Center; a 766-acre, mixed-use, \$500 million, three-phase development. He now owns a controlling interest in more than 2 million square feet of office, retail, and mixed-use properties located primarily in Western Pennsylvania.

In the early 1990's, Michael co-founded Pennsylvania Capital Bank and was instrumental in its sale to Three Rivers Bank in 2001 which was later acquired by Huntington Bank. In 2002, he began another new venture with the development of over 150 oil and gas wells in Pennsylvania.

Branching out from his real estate and banking successes, Michael pursued business opportunities in other fields, most notably Healthcare Technology. In 1991, Michael co-invested in TeleTracking Technologies, when the company was in its earliest phase as a start-up. Since then, the company has grown the patient flow and operations market it created into a multimillion-dollar annual business that is now the recognized as the world leader in healthcare operations management and Operational Command Centers. TeleTracking manages over 1/3 of the United States acute care beds and has over 100 Operational Command Centers in the United States and United Kingdom. Michael serves as TeleTracking's CEO and Chairman, and he is passionately engaged and dedicated to the company's mission to ensure that no one will ever wait for the care that they need.

Michael's personal commitment to giving back to his community is exemplified in his involvement and ongoing support of Mission of Mercy Pittsburgh; an annual two-day free dental clinic providing the underserved in the Tri-State area with free dental care. The event brings more than 1,400 volunteers together to provide everything from dental cleanings, radiographs and exams to restorative dentistry, endodontics and even dentoalveolar surgery. Many of the volunteer doctors who graciously donate their time are regionally and nationally
