


Summer in Israel

Internship

I interned at a computer vision startup in downtown Haifa as a Data Scientist and Machine Learning Engineer. The company was developing an AR platform that helps users virtually apply makeup. As an intern, my projects mostly focused on data analytics, including collecting and cleaning data of cosmetics products to help build a database and training a machine learning model that detects

facial landmarks. Even though the company is very small, it has very friendly employees and relaxing working environment. At the end of my internship, I built close relationship with people in the company and other interns.
