School and Day Care Information

Carnegie Mellon Schools

There are two excellent day care/pre-school facilities on Carnegie Mellon's campus:

Public Schools

In Pittsburgh, children are assigned to schools according to their residential address. For information about how to enroll your child in public school call the Pittsburgh Public Schools at 412-622-7920. Information is also available on their website, <u>http://www.pps.k12.pa.us/site/default.aspx?PageID=1</u>. To inquire about Magnet Schools (schools with a special educational focus such as German language, international studies, performing arts, science and technology, etc.) call 412-622-3991. For information about the ESL program, consult the main website or call 412-622-3620. To enroll your child, you must provide specific documentation:

- proof of your identity and current visa status for you and your child, i.e. passport (and that of the child), immigration documents, and a birth certificate for the child,
- immunization records, which have been officially translated (including dates),
- official translated transcripts if you wish your child to attend a grade level higher than which is considered typical for his/her age in the US,
- the US Social Security Number of at least one parent,
- proof of residence in the City of Pittsburgh by providing two documents which show a current Pittsburgh address, (any two of the following: driver's license, utility bill, tax statement, copy of a lease).

Private Schools

There are also private schools for K-12 students. Some are affiliated with a religious organization and some are not. Private school tuition can range up to \$15,000 (or more) per year; some scholarships may be available. Inquire at the admission office at each school.
