Biography

Paul Gottlieb

Associate Professor of Agricultural, Food,
and Resource Economics, Rutgers University

Professor Paul Gottlieb currently chairs the Agricultural, Food, and Resource Economics Department at Rutgers University. In his previous position as Director of the Center for Regional Economic Issues at Case Western Reserve University, he conducted numerous studies on the demographic and economic characteristics of older industrial regions. His most widely-read policy reports include *The Metropolitan New Economy Index* (Progressive Policy Institute, 1999), *Older Central Counties in the New Economy* (U.S. Economic Development Administration, 2001), and *Growth without Growth* (Brookings Institution, 2002).

Dr. Gottlieb's work has been featured in numerous media outlets including the Christian Science Monitor, Governing Magazine, the Plain Dealer, the Columbus Dispatch, the Cincinnati Enquirer, newspapers in Seattle, Pittsburgh, Austin, and other cities, NBC and ABC affiliates in Cleveland, and Clear Channel radio, where he has been a regular guest. He founded the award-winning Weatherhead School journal *Innovation for Regional Advantage*, and is currently on the editorial board of *Economic Development Quarterly*.

In the late 1980s, Dr. Gottlieb served as a regional planner with the New Jersey Office of Smartgrowth (then known as the Office of State Planning). This position kindled an interest in urban sprawl and growth management, which constitute the bulk of his research activities at Rutgers.

Professor Gottlieb holds a doctorate from Princeton University's Woodrow Wilson School and an A.B. degree from Harvard University.
