Corinne Hermant-de Callataÿ

Corinne Hermant-de Callataÿ is a senior policy officer in the Directorate-General for Regional and Urban Policy of the European Commission. She is co-author of the European *'Cities of tomorrow'* report.

Corinne holds a master degree in Economic Sciences from Paris-Dauphine University.

After starting her career as an urban researcher within the French National Research Centre, Corinne's research moved onto the examination of the social and economic impact of information and communication technology and published "To teach and to learn with computers" (Ed. Nathan, 330 pages, Paris, 1985).

Corinne joined the European Commission in 1988, designing and implementing European Union research programmes on technology enhanced learning. From 1995, she worked on the programme of European cooperation in education, as a follow-up of the Erasmus student mobility programme, and became coordinator of the Open and Distance Learning action of the European Socrates programme.

In 2004, she joined the Technics, Regional Planning and Society Research Centre (LATTS), part of the École des Ponts ParisTech Engineering Institute, as Secretary General.

Returning to the European Commission in 2006, Corinne now works as a senior policy officer, advising on policy development on urban and territorial issues. In 2011, she co-authored a report on *'Cities of tomorrow'* published by the European Commission, following a Europe-wide reflection process with stakeholders and researchers. She also manages the triennial *Perception Survey on Quality of Life* in European Cities, the last of which was conducted in 78 cities and published early October 2013.
