
























- Streets: these will carry vehicular traffic and will reflect Hungate, Dundas Street, Camelite Street, Black Horse Lane junction with kerbs and footpaths
- Squares/St John's Square: car free, with high quality hard landscaping and street furniture and with active uses at ground floor level and containing an outdoor performance space
- Riverside piazza/Friars Quay: car free piazza with active uses at ground level, facing River Foss with Rowntree Wharf forming the southern edge
- Foot streets: Pound Lane, Palmer Street, Pond Garth; pedestrian priority with vehicles limited to servicing and emergency access only
- Courts: Focal Community Building, private courtyards to residential
- Quayside: hard landscaped quayside route beside Foss, with soft landscaped edge to waterside
- Foot and cycle bridge: modern bridge providing pedestrian and cycle access across River Foss
- Natural edge: soft landscaping to River Foss and Nature Reserve
- Snickelway: narrow route linking St Johns Square to Friars Quay


Characteristics

- Mixed uses at ground floor creates an animated street scene
- Predominantly pedestrianised with access for service and emergency vehicles only.
- · Good quality hard landscaping and street furniture
- · Lack of soft landscaping street trees only
- · Consistent building line
- · Some corners rounded or on the diagonal leading into space
- · Focal buildings
- · Some variation in building height
- · Variation in plot widths
- · Continuous terraces
- · Variation in building material

- Larger buildings contain space
- · Larger openings at ground floor with horizontal emphasis at fascia level

































Bioclimatic Design: Traditional Arabian Wind/Water Cooling Typologies



















































QUO VADIS CIVITAS?

The future model for new settlements should be the **Compact City**. This is a city concept consisting of independently functioning units, in which the aspects of everyday life can be laid out and accessed within walking distance by all members of society. The **City of the Future** is a city of social and functional integration, cultural diversity, accessible education, resource conservation and regional dialogue. When outward growth is unavoidable or imperative for economic or cultural reasons, that growth should follow the principle of the **Compact City**. The following 12 principles are intended to provide the point of departure for the **Compact City** and as such serve as the foundation for the **Sustainable City**. They should be applied to all new development.
