Many non-partisan organizations publish information about where candidates stand on certain issues.

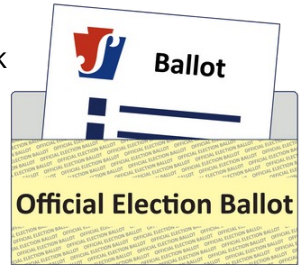


Voting by Mail?

You can check the status of your ballot online at vote.pa.gov

Complete your Paper Ballot

Follow the instructions closely to complete the ballot, in blue or black ink only.



Use the Secrecy Envelope

Once the ballot is complete, place the voted ballot into the provided yellow secrecy envelope. Do not mark the secrecy envelope.

Stuff and Sign the Declaration Envelope

Place the secrecy envelope inside of the declaration envelope. The declaration envelope must be **signed** and **dated** with the date the ballot was completed and sealed inside the envelope.

Return the Ballot In Person

OR

Add a Stamp and Mail the Envelope

Ballots can be returned to the Allegheny County Office Building by Nov. 5 or to a Ballot Return Site (ex: Carnegie Library of Squirrel Hill) by Nov. 4.

Mail-in ballots must be **received by 8 pm on Nov. 5**. Postmarks no longer apply!

If you received a mail-in ballot but choose to vote in person, you must surrender your ballot and all envelopes at your polling location. Then you will be given another ballot to vote at the polls.

STEP 5 VOTE

Polls will be open from **7 am – 8 pm**
on Nov. 5, 2024

As long as you are in line to vote by 8 pm, you can cast your vote, regardless of how long it takes to get through the line.

First Time Voter?

If you are a first-time voter or voting at a new precinct, remember to bring your CMU ID or another form of identification to the polls with you.

Questions about your eligibility or mail-in voting status while at the polls?

You can request to vote using a provisional ballot.
