Strong Women Strong Girls

Strong Women Strong Girls is a nationally recognized mentoring organization dedicated to creating an outside support system for young girls and helping them develop skills for lifelong success. The Carnegie Mellon chapter of SWSG was launched in 2006 and ever since has been working towards empowering young girls living in underserved communities across Pittsburgh. Every week, mentors meet with the girls for 60 minutes (via zoom) and organize lessons that aim to help them recognize their potential strengths and encourage them to pursue their dreams. The curriculum is based on historic and contemporary female role models who embody the ideas of strong women and global sisterhood. Our program strives to build positive mentoring relationships and combat the danger of low self-esteem in pre-adolescent girls. Currently, the Carnegie Mellon chapter mentors at five different elementary school sites. The CMU chapter of SWSG holds annual campus field trip for the girls at our mentoring sites. The purpose of the field trip is to expose young girls to college experience and inspire them to pursue post-secondary education in the future. In particular, our field trip activities highlight the studying areas of science, technology, engineering and mathematics, where women are usually underrepresented. Our mentors are all super excited to welcome our girls to CMU campus this fall for the next field trip!
