Departures and Arrivals

Here are some steps to take no matter where you are in your study abroad journey:



Departing this Summer or Fall

- Once admitted to a program, be sure to let your study abroad advisor know!
- Register for a required [Pre-Departure Orientation Session](#).
- Enroll in and complete the [Study Abroad Pre-Departure Canvas Course](#).
- Complete your CMU Required Forms, including the [SATC form](#), in the [Study Abroad Portal](#) by **April 15**.

Returning to Pittsburgh

- Make sure you've requested your study abroad transcripts be mailed to the CMU registrar! You can find the address information on [The HUB's website](#).
- If you changed courses from what was initially approved on your SATC, you will need to complete and submit a [Follow-Up SATC form](#) to the [Study Abroad Portal](#).



Regional Spotlight: Oceania

Oceania is the region of more than 10,000 islands between Asia and the Americas in the Pacific Ocean and inhabited by over 44 million people. This region includes Australia, Aotearoa New Zealand, Fiji, Tonga, Samoa, Papua New Guinea, Palau, Vanuatu and many others. CMU students can study abroad in this region and use all of their CMU financial aid to study at institutions like the University of Melbourne, Bond University, University of New South Wales, National Institute of Dramatic Arts (NIDA) and the University of Auckland.
