

Did you know? For undergraduate study abroad, CMU has a <u>university-wide</u> <u>exchange</u> with the University of Melbourne, and <u>sponsored study abroad programs</u> at the University of New South Wales (UNSW) and the National Institute of Dramatic Arts (NIDA), both in Sydney, and Bond University in Queensland, Gold Coast.

Engineering a Summer to Remember

Learn and explore real-world engineering in Germany.

This exciting new CMU Study Abroad program is open to CIT students in their first, second or third year of study. Travel with CIT to southern Germany this summer! The trip will be composed of two parts:

For the first three weeks, live and study in Freiburg, Germany, while taking an intensive German course. An introductory level course will be held specifically for up to 16 CIT students.

Anyone needing a higher level course will be able to take one. Earn 12 units of transferable general education credit. Local cultural events and travel to nearby countries on weekends will be available to all students. Plenty of free time to explore



Then, for the final week of your time in Germany, travel as a group led by CIT staff to engineering companies and research facilities in Baden-Wurttemberg, a strong engineering area of Europe. This <u>website</u> gives more general industry information.
