RESEARCH

Summer Undergraduate Research Fellowships (SURF)

The Summer Undergraduate Research Fellowship (SURF) awards \$4500 to undergraduates at Carnegie Mellon for 8-10 full-time weeks of summer research in any field of study, including artistic/creative inquiry. The student proposal *deadline is* **Mar. 22** with faculty letter of recommendation due **Mar. 26**. More information can be found on the **SURF website**.

Small Undergraduate Research Grants (SURG)

The Small Undergraduate Research Grants (SURG) program offers grants for materials and supplies to undergraduates at Carnegie Mellon for research in any field of study. For summer 2023 and fall 2023 grants, the student proposal *deadline is* **Mar. 22** with faculty letter of recommendation due **Mar. 26**. More information can be found on the **SURG** website.

<u>Summer Undergraduate Research Apprenticeship</u> (SURA)

99-270 (3, 6, 9, or 12 units, tuition free)

Complete a research apprenticeship with a faculty member in any field of study, including artistic/creative inquiry, and engage in professional development programming offered by the Office of Undergraduate Research and Scholar Development. *Deadline*: **May 22.** Application Information can be found on the SURA website.

Undergraduate Summer Research

99-409 (1 unit, tuition free)

This course allows undergraduate students from all fields to participate in research (including artistic/creative inquiry) under the direction of a CMU faculty member. Students should have previously participated in summer research via the Summer Undergraduate Research Apprenticeship and/ or the Summer Undergraduate Research Fellowship before enrolling. Two forms are required prior to enrollment – one from the student and one from the advising faculty member. Deadline: May 12

Collaborative Research Through Projects

99-520 (6 or 9 units, tuition-free)

These collaborative research courses aim to provide students with the opportunity to engage in cohort-based research endeavors that makes a contribution to an area of research, field, or topic. Most courses have limited prerequisites. Students can review the listing of courses in this document as well as learn how to enroll. Preferred deadline:

Mar. 27; Final enrollment deadline: May 5.

Community-Based Research-to-Practice Program

The Research-to-Practice grant awards \$5000 for 8-10 weeks of full-time summer research that positively impacts the Greater Pittsburgh Region community. The student proposal *deadline is* **Apr. 19** with faculty letter of recommendation due **Apr. 24**. More information can be found on the **Program website**.

INTERNSHIPS

Undergraduate Summer Internship

99-412 (1 unit, tuition free)

Available to undergraduate students whose internship sites require credit bearing enrollment for eligibility. The internship is for elective credit only and must be unpaid. Two forms are required prior to enrollment – one from the student and one from the student and one-from the student and one-from the employer. Deadline: May 12

Summer Internship Experience Fund (SIEF)

The SIEF is available to current undergraduate students who have secured an off-campus, low paying or unpaid internship located in the United States during the summer of 2023. This needs-based grant aims to help offset expenses incurred during internships. *Rolling application deadlines:*Mar. 3, Apr. 7, & May 5. <u>The Peter C. Dozzi Pittsburgh Internship Initiative</u> (<u>Dozzi</u>)

The Dozzi was created in 2004 through a gift by Mr. Peter C. Dozzi. This fund is open to current undergraduates who have secured a low-paying or unpaid summer internship within the Pittsburgh region. *Application deadline:* **April 21.** More information can be found on the **Dozzi website** with questions directed to Career and Professional Development Center.

Department-Based Internship Course

Contact your academic advisor in your primary major department for more information on this option. A note for international students: This course can be used for Curricular Practical Training (CPT). These units are charged at the university's per unit cost.

Unpaid Internship Course Tuition Support Program

Any CMU graduate or undergraduate student with a verified, unpaid summer internship and enrolled in a companion, 3 unit, departmental internship or practicum course is eligible to apply for funding to offset a portion of the tuition cost of that course. Applications will be reviewed and accepted on a first come first serve basis up to the capacity of available funding. Tuition support is contingent upon completion of the approved unpaid internship and course requirements. This program will provide 1 free unit of credit. *Deadline:* June 1.
